#### **Homiletics**

#### Attribute/s of Outcome Based Ordination this course addresses

- 6. To learn from others new ideas about preaching and sermons.
- 7. To learn what a biblical sermon is and to understand its power.

An introductory classroom experience dealing with the call to preach; the spiritual formation of the preacher; picture preaching; sermon preparation resources; the creation of sermon introductions, bodies and conclusions; the techniques of public communication for our time.
